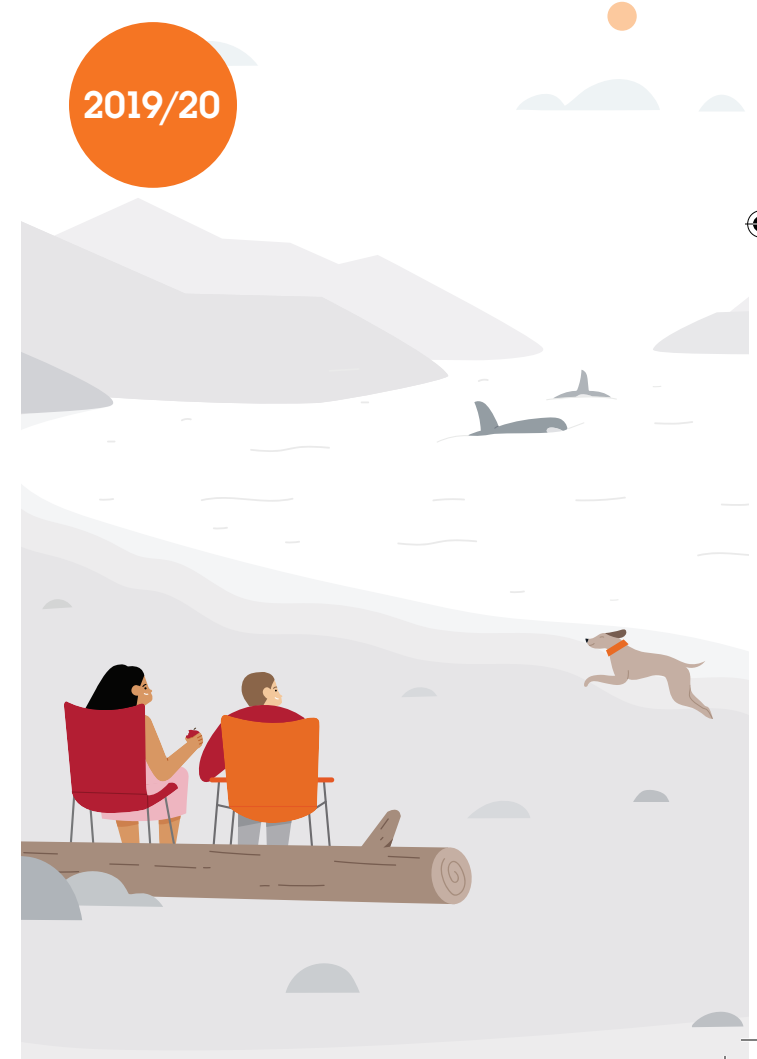

CHILDREN'S HEALTH FOUNDATION OF VANCOUVER ISLAND

Throughout the year, the Elements Casino Victoria team holds fundraisers and volunteers with their signature charity, the Children's Health Foundation of Vancouver Island. Elements Casino Victoria chose this charity to help ensure all Island families have access to the health care they need. Children's Health Foundation of Vancouver Island helps transform the lives of children and youth living with physical and mental health challenges.

PLAYING IT FORWARD IN VIEW ROYAL

The Town of View Royal previously allocated its share of provincial gambling revenue from hosting Elements Casino Victoria to a range of community initiatives, associations and events through its Grants-in-Aid program.

One organization that received funds was the Greater Victoria Crossing Guards Association, which was allocated up to \$15,000 to provide crossing guards at various intersections throughout View Royal. These services were offered at both View Royal Elementary School and Eagle View Elementary School to help kids and parents have peace of mind and safe passage as they head to and from school each day.

Funding was also allocated to the M'akola Housing Society, which provides subsidized housing, affordable rentals and assisted living units, primarily for Aboriginal people and families.

Each year, local governments in B.C. that host a gambling facility receive a 10 per cent share of the net revenue those facilities generate. Last year, **32** Host Local Governments across B.C. received **\$93.5 million** in provincial gambling revenue to fund local projects and initiatives.
